- *Due to VERY limited camp space this year:*
 - *There may be waitlists for both boy and girl campers, if your child develops a conflict in scheduling, please let us know as soon as possible.*
 - *The price of camp per camper is \$250.00.*
- *Due to VERY limited space in cabins, we can make NO guarantees about cabin mates.*
 - *We will try to put campers in a cabin with same school, similar ages & grades.*
 - *Our motto this year is: "Make New Friends!"*

Where: Camp North Central, Carlisle, Kentucky. The camp is owned & operated by UK.

Who: Camp is open to youth, age 9 through 14. You do not have to be a 4-H member.

Departure: We depart from the former Boyd County Fairgrounds on June 15. We will do a lice check and a temp check before campers can board the buses. Transportation to the camp will be provided by 4-H.

At Kentucky 4-H Camp, we are taking additional steps this summer to protect our campers, volunteers and employees. Our COVID Mitigation and Operations Plan is designed to address COVID-19 and includes virus prevention methods, supply and resource procurement, communication and training, cabin-centric programming, and increased cleaning and sanitizing procedures.

Fourteen Days prior to check-in on 6-15, ALL campers will be required to begin a daily screening leading up to the first day of camp. This provided form includes screening questions, temperature, and symptom checks and is due upon arrival on check-in day. The screening form is included in your participation packet.

Frequently Asked Questions

Is there a guarantee siblings will all be selected?

There is no guarantee siblings will all be selected.

Will my child get to select their camp classes?

No, this year, your child will participate in every class offered by 4-H camp. These classes include: Recreation, Nature, Riflery, Low and High Ropes, Archery, Canoeing, & Kayaking. There will be 4 additional classes taught by the county volunteers/staff that at this time are still to be determined.

What if my child does not want to participate in one or more of the classes?

All campers will attend every class with their group. They will be encouraged but not required to participate.

Will there be a camper/parent orientation before camp?

Yes, there will be a mandatory camper orientation Friday, June 11, 2021 at the former Boyd County Fairgrounds. You may attend at anytime between 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM.

If my child is a returning camper, what can they expect to be different this year?

- Fewer campers in each cabin
- No Sally Down the Alley
- No lake swim (we WILL be swimming in the pool!)
- With counselor supervision, campers will attend all classes and activities along with their same pre-determined 'team' of campers (only those campers from their cabin as well as one additional cabin).
- Whole-camp activities are altered to ensure physical distancing is maintained.

Can I send mail to my camper?

This year, all mail received onsite will be returned to sender.

What will group sizes be and how will camp implement physical distancing?

We are limiting our activity groups to no more than two cabins per team. Teams will travel together to and from activities with no close interaction with any other teams. Mealtimes will be scheduled in a way that prevents teams from intermingling in or around the dining facilities and assigned seating will be mandated. Masks are required to be worn outside when 6ft physical distance cannot be guaranteed. Additionally, when indoors, masks must be worn at all times, covering both nose and mouth, unless campers are sleeping, eating, or showering.

What will happen if individuals present COVID-19 symptoms?

The individual will go to the Health Office to visit the Health Care Provider (HCP). Within the Health Office is an isolation room with a restroom. The HCP, wearing upgraded personal protective equipment including mask, gloves, gown, and face shield will ask screening questions and take the patient's temperature. If the patient has a temperature of 100.4 or higher or presents any of the symptoms listed as potentially having a COVID-19-like illness, the emergency contact will be notified immediately, and the child will need to be picked up and taken home as soon as possible. The individual will remain in isolation, under the care of the HCP, until they are picked up. Their belongings will be packed up by cabin leaders wearing masks and gloves and brought to the Health Office to await departure. The cabin of the affected individual will be cleaned and disinfected by the cabin leader(s). If an individual becomes ill during the middle of the night, they will remain in isolation at the Health Office, under the care of the HCP and University of Kentucky employees, until morning. The departure protocol, as listed above, will then be followed.

Will campers have fun at camp?

YES! Camp is about experiencing safe, fun adventures while making friends in an amazing place! We are committed to keeping campers safe as our first priority. This summer we have added methods to ensure a healthy camp environment and we are committed to creating the same incredible 4-H camp experiences that make great memories for everyone!

What can I do as a parent to prepare my child for camp this summer?

We all want camp to be a positive experience! We want campers to make friends, go on adventures, learn more about themselves, others, and their world! We ask you to frequently discuss with your camper: how to wear a mask, how to ensure good hygiene like proper hand washing, to avoid touching their face, and what 6 feet of physical distance is. We are promoting healthy habits at camp and we appreciate your help.

A 14-day pre-camp health screening form is required for your camper and we recommend you limit travel and contact with others in the 2 weeks prior to your camper's arrival to camp.
