



2025 Country Ham Projects

In early June, Boyd County 4-H'ers completed Step 2 in the Country Ham Curing Process. Hams were "shucked" from their outer paper wrapping, cleaned and re-hung for further preservation. In August, Hams will be cleaned a final time and taken to the Kentucky State Fair in Louisville for competition and judging.











Country ham curing is a process of preserving pork legs using salt and time, resulting in a distinctive, shelf-stable, and flavorful product. It involves dry-curing with salt, optional ingredients, and sometimes smoking, followed by aging to develop a unique flavor.




